members to serve their environment and neighbors while collecting important data for ongoing scientific research. Nature Vision provides community science opportunities through sponsored **Blue Team**

programs, allowing students to participate in active data collection projects at a local waterbody - all free to them!

Our free **Community Science Blue Team programs** are now also offered in a virtual setting, Students join a Nature Vision Educator for a series of classroom programs, a livestreaming of field data collection from a water source in their community, and stewardship reflection.

Here's a quote from a teacher with Riverview School District about the virtual Community Science experience: "Our students LOVED this lesson. They were so excited to test the different parts of the water. Our students were on the edges of their seats. They were engaged, passionate about share their ideas, and loved being on a field trip during remote learning. My class thought this lesson was very special."
